Vicar's Letter

I expect you, along with almost two thirds of the world's population, watched the Queen's funeral.

I never met the Queen – perhaps you did – but I have a sense of knowing her through the media: whose scrutiny has grown more intense, intrusive and polarised over the years.

We have seen the Queen through times of happiness and times of grief, dealing with family celebration and family disaster, navigating, as any engaged great-grandmother has to, the fall-outs, rivalries, successes, failures, and all the other stresses of any family, but all with a camera lens never far away.

We have seen her together with all manner of dignitaries, and heads of state from the Dalai Lama to Donald Trump, and we've seen the occasional moment of mischievous fun when she has encountered members of her own family on 'opposite sides' of an official occasion.

Her life and presence are woven deeply in to the fabric of our society: her face on our money, her emblem on post vans; we speak the Queen's English and travel the Queen's highway.

For those like me who have only ever known the Queen through the media, she is still a constant presence – it's hard to internalise that she is now dead, and that we have a king.

How could she be in that coffin, carried by those eight young men and lowered into the floor in St. George's Chapel when there she is, at every age from 9 to 90, in every country on earth, in every coloured outfit imaginable?

The National Anthem still requires attention and willpower against the instinct to sing 'God save our gracious Queen'.

The Queen was described as "England's greatest evangelist", making her faith in Jesus known gently but unmistakeably, and pointing to God as her source of inspiration and strength to carry out her role.

All of this will take time to sink in for us, and if we find it hard, how much more must Charles, so we must pray for him.

As we say goodbye to the Queen, we pray that Charles will know that same source of strength and inspiration in Jesus Christ, and we must be ready, as the Queen was, to live out the Gospel message of forgiveness and peace through Jesus, the one mediator between God and humankind.

Death of H M the Queen Elizabeth II and Accession of H M the King Charles III

As a matter of record we note that, immediately after the news of the death of H M the Queen was announced on the 8th September, the Union Flag was raised to half mast on the village green. On the 11th the flag was raised to full mast and the church bells were pealed at 11am for the Proclamation of King Charles III; the flag was then lowered to half mast until after the Queen's funeral on Monday 19th. A Book of Condolences was opened in our church and a Service Of Commemoration and Thanksgiving for Her Late Majesty was held on Sunday 18th September, with the Rev'd Nigel Pearson officiating. God Save the King!

Memories of the late Queen?

I wonder how many parishioners saw or met the late Queen? Please send in your stories to the editor. Both my brother and mother had several encounters with her, but the only time that I saw the Queen was in 1969 at the National Institute of Agricultural Botany in Cambridge, where my father worked. The Institute was then celebrating its Golden Jubilee. I remember the Queen planted a tree. My mother – a lifelong Royalist sharing the Queen's birthday of 21st April – made sure that we were only a few feet away from Her Majesty when the time came to wave goodbye. This remains a vivid memory after more than 50 years. The Queen returned to NIAB for its Centennial Jubilee in 2019.

Viola da Gamba recital, Monday, October 17th

Dear Kingston Friends and Neighbours,

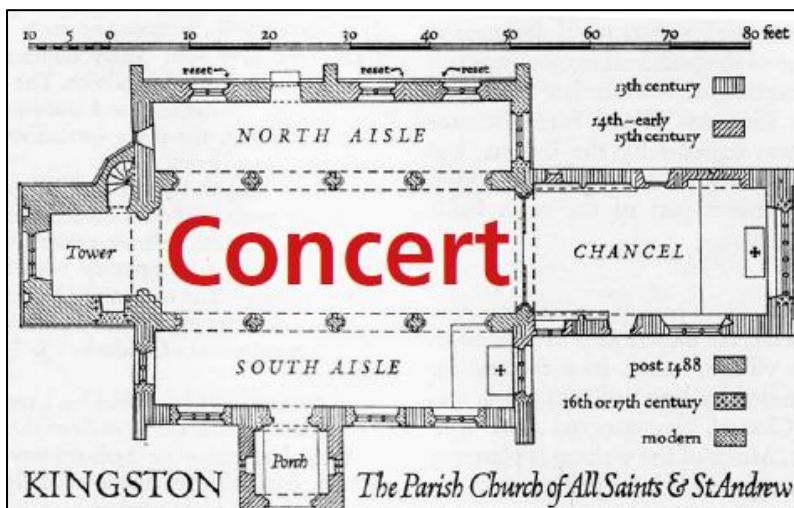
We are happy to announce this special event at All Saints and St Andrew on October 17th, the first of what we hope will be a little series of baroque and classical concerts in our church which, as we all know, has perfect acoustics for this kind of music.

Henrik Persson is one of Britain's outstanding specialists in the viola da gamba and the baroque cello. He is a regular with Florilegium, the Musical and Amicable Society, with whom he also appears as a soloist, and for the Blackdowns Early Music Projects. He was first continuo player of Philip Pickett's New London Consort and Musicians of the Globe with whom he regularly toured throughout the UK and the world for eight years. He was first continuo player for La Nuova Musica from 2007 to 2010 and a member of the European Union Baroque Orchestra 2002-03. He is a founding member of the Neue Vialles consort which are currently artists-in-residence at Saxon Shore Early Music in Kennardington in Kent.

Henrik will give an introduction to his programme and to the fascinating historic instrument he is playing: an original viol – one of at most 15 confirmed in the world, built by Edward Lewis in his shop at the back of St Paul's, London, in 1703.

Henrik has very kindly agreed to play for the benefit of the church's Restoration Fund. Refreshments will be offered, and of course you are invited to stay afterwards for a chat and some nibbles.

EWR Update:

The Cambridge City MP and Cambridge Ahead spoke out some weeks ago on the issue of EWR and wrote to the then Transport Minister Grant Shapps who had made some off the cuff comments during his failed bid for the Conservative Leadership. Luton Airport AD6 (Airspace Deployment 6):

Many more are being affected by the new airspace deployment AD6. Last month, I called for and had a meeting, supported by RELAS coordinators, with the Luton Airport Noise management staff. I explained the reality of our experiences, not their “modelled” expectations, and a number of other important issues. They have taken on board and are investigating with airlines the “loud, screeching noise” we hear, which we think is the airplanes applying their brakes.

Stagecoach Withdrawing Bus No.18:

Stagecoach has decided to withdraw Bus No.18 after 30th October 2022. The announcement has come as a shock. The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority is responsible for Transport and is aware and has made a public statement. South Cambridgeshire council to trial four-day working week

South Cambridgeshire District Council is becoming the first Council in the UK to run a four-day working week trial, which is due to run between January and March 2023.

There are approximately 470 desk-based Council staff who are due to take part, and it will apply to Council colleagues on all pay grades. If the trial is successful, they will consider extending it to bin crews later next year. Refuse crews currently empty bins for around 127,000 households across Greater Cambridge each week. A longer trial period will be considered if it is effective.


The Council's Employment and Staffing Committee will monitor service levels from January to the end of March. They will check things like how long it takes them to process benefits claims, Council house rent collections, planning applications decision times and a long list of other factors

Call When It Counts

Cambridgeshire Constabulary call handlers can receive as many as 1,300 calls to 101 and 600 emergency 999 calls in just one day. Many of the calls they receive are reports of incidents that could have been resolved using online services. This is why the force are launching a campaign to encourage people to only #CallWhenItCounts, which will reserve call handlers' time on the line for real emergencies and for people who need them the most.

There are plenty of ways to get in touch with police that do not involve calling 101. Next time you are about to dial 999 or 101, please stop and think:

- could this issue be submitted using an online report?
- could I speak to an operator using live web chat instead?
- is this an issue that should be directed to my local council instead?

Together with Cambridgeshire Constabulary's online services, we can ease the pressure our call handlers are under. To launch a live web chat, visit www.cambs.police.uk and click the green icon in the bottom corner of the screen. To submit a report, visit www.cambs.police.uk/report

(Remember to always call 999 in an emergency situation, if a serious crime is in progress or you think it is imminent.)

Patient Survey – Top 10%

The results of the GP Patient Survey have been published and Bourn Surgery has continued to perform well. The survey is sent to over two million people across the UK asking people how they feel about their GP Surgery. Despite the demands on us being high we remain committed to delivering the best service we can and improving wherever possible. It's important to take the opportunity to recognise the dedication and professionalism of our team and thank our patients for recognising it.

New GP Registrars

We welcome two new GP Registrars to Bourn Surgery starting this month. Dr Sakina Bokhari and Dr Thomas Stocks are both doctors with several years' experience who are in the final stages of their training to become a GP.

Emergency Appointments

Appointments can be booked in advance either in person or remotely and with a clinician of choice. We maintain "on the day" appointments for acute urgent issues to ensure we can treat people that need it. These will be with any of our clinical team. Please book ahead if it is an anticipated medical need.

Flu Clinics

We are busy planning for the 2022 flu campaign. We will be running clinics on several Saturdays in October – these are not yet open to book until we have confirmation of deliveries of this year's flu vaccines. We will invite you to book nearer the time by text message, and update our website soon. Please do not contact reception to book until invited to do so.

We are planning to offer you the Covid booster vaccine at the same visit. This will need to be at least 91 days after any Spring Booster you might have received. Please support the surgery by booking your vaccinations with us this year, rather than going elsewhere for it.

We have ordered enough Flu vaccines for all eligible patients, and will hope to be able to offer to the wider group of over 50s again from November onwards as per Government advice.

We will again be looking for volunteers to help us run our busy Saturday Clinics – do contact our practice manager tracey.wilson@nhs.net if you would like to volunteer. The date for October so far is Saturday 15 October
