#### Vicar's Letter

Potholes. You can't have failed to notice them getting worse and worse over the past few months. They've reached a point where many of the local roads are an obstacle course for drivers – and positively dangerous for cyclists.

Rain water gets into the tiniest cracks, widening them when it freezes. It dissolves away anything vaguely soluble, loosening the bindings between the stones of the road surface. And its sheer flow washes away the resulting debris, exposing new areas to its effects.

Then the pounding of traffic, especially buses and lorries compounds all these effects.

Patching a pothole brings temporary respite, but also leaves new weaknesses, which fail surprisingly quickly. What's really needed is not patching, but resurfacing – the taking away of the old, damaged material, and its replacement from the bottom up with a new, resilient surface.

For many of us, life is feeling a bit like our roads at the moment – full of potholes, and difficult, painful, or even dangerous to navigate.

Like a rush of water, the everyday burdens of life – the cost of living, bad news and divisiveness in the media, the continuing effects of covid, and much more – all wear away at our solidity and integrity.

The thud of specific events – an illness, a bereavement, a job loss, a relationship breakdown – destabilises an already fragile structure.

The temptation is to patch the holes – a new job, or a new relationship, or some other form of self-gratification. This might bring some temporary relief, but it won't

last: what we need is a thorough restoration. We need the old, broken stuff taking away and something new put in its place. We need renewal, not just repair, and for that we need help.

The 23rd Psalm begins "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul." And Jesus promised "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest."

If your life feels full of potholes right now, there is help and renewal to be found – just ask.

#### Papworth Team Increasing Generosity

The churches of the Papworth Team have almost raised the target amount of £8,000 towards a new Mission Research Centre for the Leprosy Mission England and Wales in Anandaban, Nepal. The Team has also responded to the Disasters Emergency Committee's appeal for aid for the victims of the earthquake in Turkey and Syria (<a href="www.dec.org.uk">www.dec.org.uk</a>). #### **Church Emergency Meeting**

The Emergency Meeting held in the Village Hall on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March was reasonably well attended and there was a wide ranging discussion of the various issues concerning the future viability of the parish church. The critical question remains unresolved, however, and that is the lack of people in the village able and willing to join the Parochial Church Council. In the long term a parish church cannot function legally without a PCC. The earliest mention of a church in Kingston dates from 1092, but it is almost certain that continuous Christian worship in this place goes back more than a thousand years to the pre-Conquest Anglo-Saxon era. Kingston church is currently not only solvent but over the last three years has managed to raise the enormous sum of £135,000, almost enough to fund the extensive repairs which are due to commence later this year. If the church is to have a future in Kingston it needs people to get involved. That future is in your hands.

#### KINGSTON MUSIC CLUB

The next meeting of the Kingston Music Club will be held in the Village Hall at 7.30 pm on Thursday 20 April. Miki Ellar will take a provocative look at 'Protest Songs', drawing examples from the USA and elsewhere, with an account of the background and the context within which these songs came to the fore. Expect to hear words and melodies that transport you back to key moments in popular culture and history. As usual the bar will be open, and everyone is welcome.


We celebrated World Book Day with a focus on books that have characters and storylines which represent diverse characters and settings, and of course, children dressed up as their favourite book characters.


