Vicar's Letter

June 18th this year is Father's Day. As celebrations go, it's mostly a creation of the greetings-card industry, but it does give us a chance to reflect on fatherhood.

The Bible contains many metaphors and images of God in relationship with humanity. Some of these images are drawn from experiences of mothering, some are drawn from the natural world, and some are abstract, but one of the key images of God in the Christian faith is God the Father.

I realise that for some people this is a sensitive subject: as we are frequently reminded, there are absent fathers and even abusive fathers, as well as lost fathers, and not everyone has a good relationship with their father.

The last time Jesus' earthly father Joseph appears in the Gospel narrative is when Jesus is 12 so it may be that Jesus' own experience, when he started his public ministry, included the absence of the man who had brought him up as father.

As an adult, Jesus referred to God as 'father' many times, and explored the idea in his parable of the Prodigal Son. In the parable, the father gives the younger son his independence, though it is at great risk. As well as possibly losing his son, the father sees half his wealth vanish. Having done this, he waits and watches. The son wastes all his money on dissolute living, and eventually decides to return and accept his disgrace.

However, when the father glimpses his returning son in the distance he runs to embrace him and draw him back into relationship. He doesn't merely forgive, but his forgiveness is super-abundant. After this, the father carries on working to reconcile not just his younger son to himself, but his older son too, and the two sons to each other.

So Jesus gave us a glimpse of what it means to have God as our father – a God who is as generous, as unwilling to let us go, as patient, as forgiving as the father in the parable.

This should liberate us to be more adventurous, even though we might make more mistakes. It should encourage us to be more forgiving to those who make mistakes around us. And it should bring us in faith to receive the welcome and forgiveness of our loving heavenly Father.
